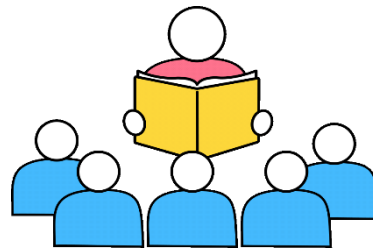

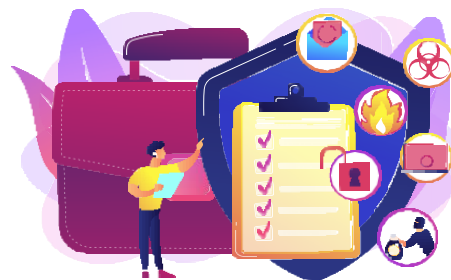

Our Reach

In the year 2022-23, Samanvit Shiksha Sansthan has made meaningful strides in empowering communities through impactful initiatives. With **10 projects implemented successfully**, we have touched and transformed the lives of over **2,00,000 individuals** across diverse sectors such as education, health, hygiene, and livelihoods. These achievements were made possible through **7 strong collaborations** with government bodies, CSR partners, and grassroots organizations — reinforcing our commitment to inclusive development and sustainable change.



Key Projects and Achievements

1. Renovation of Fulwari Creche and Adharshila School with Container Corporation of India – CONCOR

With the generous support of Container Corporation of India (CONCOR), Samanvit Shiksha Sansthan undertook the much-needed renovation of the **Fulwari Crèche** and **Adharshila School**, institutions that provide early childhood care and foundational education to underprivileged children. The renovation initiative included structural repairs, classroom refurbishments, improved sanitation facilities, installation of child-friendly furniture, and beautification of learning spaces. The project aims to create a safe, hygienic, and stimulating learning environment, encouraging regular attendance and enhancing the overall educational experience for the children. This collaboration reflects CONCOR's commitment to education and community development under its CSR initiatives.



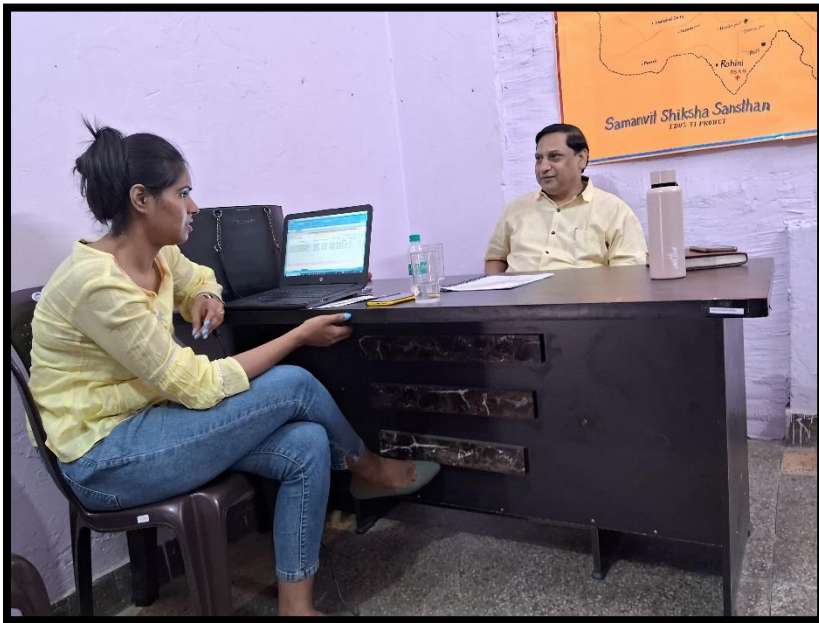
2. Donation of 5 SEB – 18 Shuttle to All India Institute of Medical Sciences with Container Corporation of India – CONCOR

Under its CSR initiative, **Container Corporation of India (CONCOR)**, in collaboration with Samanvit Shiksha Sansthan, donated 5 SEB-18 electric shuttle vehicles to **All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS)**, New Delhi. These eco-friendly shuttles are used for internal transport of patients, attendants, and staff across the hospital campus. The initiative aims to ease mobility, enhance patient care, and promote sustainable, green transport within the healthcare facility.



3. Targeted Intervention for Injecting Drug Users (IDU's) for HIV/AIDS Prevention with Delhi State AIDS Control Society – DSACS

Samanvit Shiksha Sansthan, with support from the **Delhi State AIDS Control Society (DSACS)**, is implementing a Targeted Intervention project for **Injecting Drug Users (IDUs)**. The initiative focuses on **HIV/AIDS prevention**, harm reduction, and promoting safe practices among high-risk populations. Key services include needle-syringe exchange, counseling, STI treatment referral, and linkages to healthcare facilities. The project aims to reduce HIV transmission and improve the health and well-being of vulnerable communities in Delhi.



4. Donation of JBM Electric 9 Mtr. Bus to All India Institute of Medical Sciences with Container Corporation of India – CONCOR

Under its CSR initiative, Container Corporation of India (CONCOR), in collaboration with Samanvit Shiksha Sansthan, donated a **JBM 9-meter electric bus** to **All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), New Delhi**. This fully electric, zero-emission bus is being used for internal staff and patient transportation within the AIIMS campus. The initiative promotes sustainable mobility, reduces environmental impact, and improves accessibility across the healthcare facility.



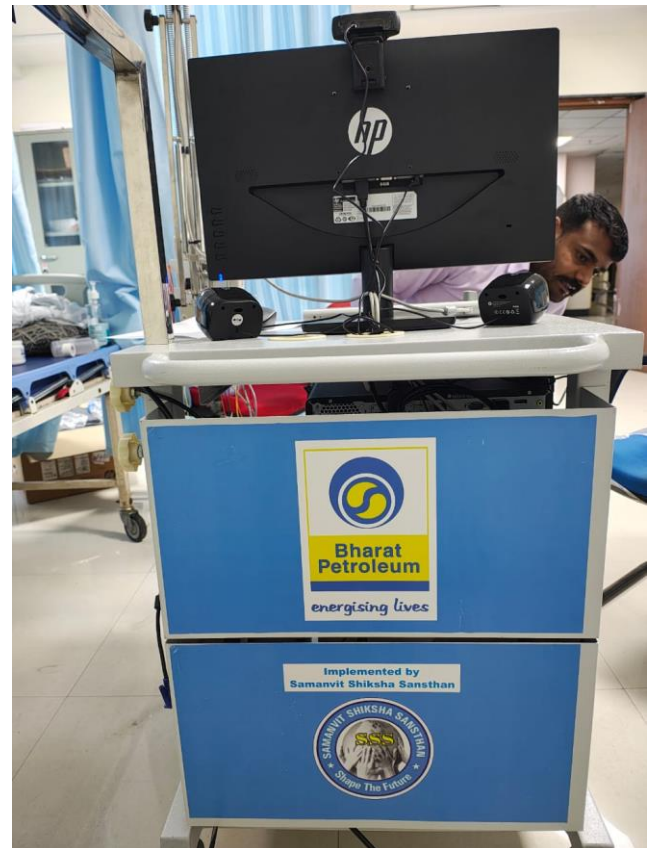
5. Donation of Medical Equipment to Institute of Human Behaviour and Allied Sciences with Container Corporation of India – CONCOR

Samanvit Shiksha Sansthan, in partnership with **Container Corporation of India (CONCOR)**, donated essential **medical equipment** to the **Institute of Human Behaviour and Allied Sciences (IHBAS), Delhi** under a CSR initiative. The support aimed to strengthen mental health and neurological care services at the institute. The equipment has enhanced diagnostic and treatment capabilities, directly benefiting patients with psychiatric and neurological disorders.



6. Donation of Medical Equipment to Govt. Hospital Indore with Bharat Petroleum Corporation Ltd. – BPCL

Under its CSR initiative, **Bharat Petroleum Corporation Ltd. (BPCL)**, in collaboration with **Samanvit Shiksha Sansthan**, donated essential **medical equipment** to a **Government Hospital in Indore**. This initiative aimed to strengthen public healthcare infrastructure and improve patient care services. The donated equipment has enhanced the hospital's diagnostic and treatment capabilities, benefiting hundreds of patients daily.



7. Installation of Sanitary Napkin Vending Machines in Govt. Schools/ Colleges with GAIL India Ltd.

Samanvit Shiksha Sansthan, in collaboration with **GAIL (India) Ltd.**, has initiated a CSR project to install **Sanitary Napkin Vending Machines** in selected **Government Schools and Colleges**. This project is designed to promote **menstrual hygiene management (MHM)**, reduce absenteeism among adolescent girls, and foster a healthier, stigma-free environment around menstruation.

Current Status:

- **Permission has been officially obtained** from the **District Education Officer (DEO)** for implementation.
- The **procurement process for machines has begun**, ensuring timely delivery and installation.
- Schools and colleges have been identified based on need and student population.

Key Components of the Project:

- Installation of user-friendly sanitary napkin vending machines in girl's washrooms or accessible areas.
- Supply of initial stock of sanitary napkins.
- Basic training for school staff on usage and restocking.
- Awareness sessions on menstrual hygiene, cleanliness, and health.

Expected Outcomes:

- Better access to menstrual hygiene products for adolescent girls.
- Improved attendance and participation in school activities.
- Reduction in health risks due to lack of proper menstrual hygiene.
- Increased awareness and normalization of menstruation among students and staff.

Challenges & Learnings

Challenges Faced:

1. Logistical Hurdles in Remote Areas:

- Implementing programs in rural or tribal regions often faced transportation issues, poor internet connectivity, and limited availability of trained human resources.

2. Beneficiary Mobilization:

- Creating awareness and encouraging participation, especially in health and skilling projects, required additional community engagement efforts.

3. Monitoring & Evaluation (M&E):

- Ensuring consistent documentation, data collection, and reporting across all field locations required additional staff training and digital tools.

4. Post-COVID Behavioural Shift:

- Continued apprehension in public gatherings and institutional hesitancy in program collaborations slightly impacted community outreach activities.

Key Learnings:

1. Strengthening Internal Controls:

- Developed more streamlined finance and documentation systems to ensure accuracy, transparency, and faster reporting.

2. Partnership Building:

- Strategic collaborations with local institutions, self-help groups, and CSR partners helped improve project efficiency and reach.

3. Digital Adaptation:

- Adoption of digital tools for beneficiary tracking, virtual training, and MIS reporting proved to be efficient and scalable.

4. Community Engagement:

- Regular engagement with local influencers and stakeholders increased program acceptance and ownership among the target population.

Future Plans & Goals (2025–2026)

Strategic Goals:

1. Expand Project Footprint:

- Reach 5 new districts across underserved regions of India with core programs in **education, health, and skill development**.

2. Enhance Impact Measurement:

- Develop a centralized **Monitoring & Evaluation (M&E) system** to track real-time progress and improve transparency for donors and stakeholders.

3. Strengthen Digital Infrastructure:

- Launch a **digital platform** for e-learning, beneficiary registration, and remote mentoring to improve accessibility and efficiency.

4. Mobilize Sustainable Funding:

- Build long-term partnerships with **corporate CSR, government schemes, and international donors** to diversify funding sources and reduce project dependency.

5. Promote Women and Youth Empowerment:

- Initiate focused programs targeting **women entrepreneurship, digital literacy, and job-linked skill training** for rural youth.

6. Environmental Responsibility:

- Implement **green initiatives** including afforestation, water conservation, and eco-club formation in schools to foster environmental consciousness.

7. Strengthen Internal Capacity:

- Invest in **staff training, governance, and financial systems** to ensure accountability, quality delivery, and donor confidence.

8. Regulatory Preparedness:

- Ensure all compliance is maintained proactively for **80G, 12A**, and other applicable laws for future growth and credibility.
